CHAPTER FOUR

POSTAL RATE INFORMATION

It is surprisingly difficult to obtain authoritative information on post-war postal rates, possibly as postal historians have concentrated on pre-war events. The following has been compiled from a variety of published sources.

Air mail rates effective from 1 January 1946:

Air mail: From 1 January 1946, BOAC resumed public passenger services and a 50c. air mail rate to UK was introduced.

Air mail routes were still negotiated on a case-by-case basis as new routes were opened up. It is therefore not possible to give a simple table of rates to all destinations before the rates were eventually grouped into zones. For a list of known rates, readers are advised to consult Chapter 3 of The Postal History of Malaya, Volume I, by E. B. Proud, 2nd Edition, published by Proud-Bailey Co. Ltd. in 2000.

Other rates applicable at this date are not known.

Internal air mail rates effective from 1 May 1947:

Internal air mail within Malaya was introduced with a 15c. letter rate for the first ounce and 8c. for each additional ounce. Mail leaving Malaya after the internal flight had to carry the appropriate normal postage to the destination in addition to the internal air fee. It has been suggested that postcards were carried at an 8c. rate. ³

The registration fee was increased from 15c. to 20c. on 15 August 1947.⁴

During 1948, the internal printed paper rate was increased from 3c. to 4c. per 2 oz. The external rate rose from 3c. to 6c. for the first 2 oz. and 3c. per additional 2 oz. ⁵

Internal air mail rates effective from 6 September 1947: 6

Internal air mail rate within Malaya for letters was reduced to 13c. air fee for the first ounce and 6c. for each additional ounce. I have been shown a postcard sent airmail Singapore to Penang on 10 December 1948 at 6c. rate. ⁷ The internal air mail service ceased to be offered to the public circa June-July 1949. Mail was then carried by the "quickest available service, whether by road, rail or air".

This price increase created a differential of 5c. between the printed matter rates applied by Malaysia and Singapore, which led to attempts by Malaysian companies to post their mail in Singapore. The Malaysian Post office fined the companies concerned under Rule 224 of the Post Office Rules and Article 23 of the Universal Postal Convention.

Rate changes effective from 1 February 1985:

The Insured post service had been withdrawn in 1948 during the Emergency. Although rate had been quoted in the interim, it is believed that the service remained suspended because of the inability to get insurance cover during first the Emergency and then the Confrontation in what was still technically a war zone. It was now made available to the public after a 37 year gap.

Overseas airmail rates remained unchanged since at least January 1995.

Rates effective from 1 March 2005:

From 1 March 2005, Malaysia abandoned the traditional letter, printed paper and small packet classes of mail in favour of "Standard", "Non-Standard" and "Periodical". Aerogrammes, Postcards and Parcels classes remained unchanged.

National Rates:

The former 30s. basic letter rate was applied to **Standard mail**, i.e. machine-processable, sealed, matt white envelopes, not over 20g (up to 50g can be sent for 40s.), size between 90mm x 140mm x 0.25mm and 165mm x250mm x 6mm. The address must be properly structured and at least 15mm clear of the bottom of the envelope.

Non-standard mail could be sent for a minimum of 50s. (20g), with steps at 75s. (100g), RM1 (250g), RM2 (500g), RM3.50 (1kg), RM6 (2kg maximum).

Periodicals covered by permits from the Ministry of Home Affairs, posted at least twice a year (and pre-sorted if over 1000 items) benefited from reduced rates for a 5-day delivery service, starting at 25s. (up to 20g), with steps at 35s. (50g), 50s. (100g) and 70s. (250g maximum).

The domestic **registration fee** was raised to RM1.40. The overseas registration fee had risen to RM3.50 by early 2003.

Postcards remained 20s. and parcel rates were unchanged.

These were simplified and raised to deter re-mailing in Malaysia of foreign mail:

Pos Malaysia set service targets for 2007 of delivery in 2 working days within an urban area, 3 days between urban areas in the same state, 4 days between urban areas in different states or between urban and rural areas, 5 days between rural areas and 6 or 7 days between West and East Malaysia.

Rates effective from 1 October 2005:

The overseas Registration Fee was raised to RM3.90.

Rates effective from 1 July 2010.

On 6 April 2010, Pos Malaysia announced that domestic postal rates were to rise on 1 July for the first time in eighteen years. The rate increases affected standard mail below 50g, non-standard mail below 100g, periodicals, PosDokumen (printed paper), registered mail and parcels. Standard mail up to 20g increased from 30s. to 60s. Group managing director and chief executive officer Datuk Syed Faisal Albar stated that the decline in mail volume had forced Pos Malaysia to contain costs while maintaining productivity. He is quoted as saying that "This has also affected our ability to adjust the low salaries of postmen and counter clerks, which is 19% lower than their government counterparts". ¹⁷

The following table is based on that officially published by Pos Malaysia on 1 July 2010. It should be noted that one rate for non-standard mail actually went down.

Items, other than parcels, over 500g carried by air between East and West Malaysia were subject to a supplement of RM1.50 for each additional 500g. Parcels had to pay the fee on the first 500g as well. A further increase in non-standard mail fees was foreseen.
