Ducks (Anatinae) are both a wild life and economic resource.

Designed by Reign Associates, this issue comprised four counter sheets and a miniature sheet.

Counter sheets:

The 40mm x 30mm stamps showed:

30s.(A): White-winged Wood Duck (Serati Hutan, Cairina scutulata);

30s.(B): Common Teal (Itik Eropah, Anas crecca);

50s.(A): Northern Shoveler (Itik Sudu, Anas clypeata);

50s.(B): Northern Pintail (Itik Muara, Anas acuta).

They were printed in sheets of 20 (simple 4 x 5 format) by Percetakan Keselamatan Nasional using standard four-colour off-set lithography. Sheet markings were 1A (x4) above and below columns 1 and 4, colour dots to left and right of broad top margin (which carried the issue title and a relevant duck) and row 5, and Pos Malaysia emblem below R5/3. The phosphor-coated paper gave a greenish-white fluorescent reaction and a yellow-green after-glow under ultra-violet light. The paper normally had watermark Multiple SPM sideways reading down, but the 30s.(A) exists with its watermark reading up. ¹ The comb perforations measured 13.6 x 13.4 (30s.(A) also exists 12.1).

Miniature sheet:

The 100mm x 70mm sheet featured the Great Cormorant (Pependang Air, *Phalacrocorax carbo*) and incorporated a 40mm x 30mm RM2 stamp showing the bird on a nest. The paper was as for the counter sheets. Normally with watermark sideways reading down, it has also been reported reading up. ² The perforations measured 13.6 x 13.4. It was also released imperforate.

First day facilities:

The presentation pack was sold at RM4. The envelope of the presentation pack featured a Teal, a Wood Duck and another duck.

The first day cover, sold at 30s., featured a cormorant.

Centenary of National Audit Department.

The Institution of Audit of the Malay Peninsular was founded in 1906 to audit government expenditures and departmental performance in the Federated Malay States, under the Auditor-General of the FMS. There was a separate audit authority in the Straits Settlements. They merged in 1932 under the Director of Colonial Audit, based in London, with an Auditor of the Straits Settlements and FMS based in KL. The separate Institusi Audit Negara and the post of Auditor-General of the Federation of Malaya (Juru Odit Negara PTM) were re-established in 1957 at independence. These services were restructured in 2002 as the National Audit Department (Jabatan Audit Negara). A National Audit Academy was opened on 24 November 2005 at ENSTEK Seremban, Negri Sembilan.

Designed by Creative & Communications House Sdn. Bhd., this issue comprised three counter sheets.

Counter sheets:

The 40mm x 30mm stamps showed:

The comb perforations measured 12.5 x 12.7.

Designed by Hazel Design, this issue comprised three counter sheets and a miniature sheet.

- The 29mm x 34mm stamps showed:
- 30s.: Pedalai (Terap Bulu, Artocarpus sericicarpus);
- 50s.: Malay Gooseberry (Cermai, *Phyllanthus acidus*);
- RM1 (A): Seashore Mangosteen (Beruas, *Garcinia hombroniana*).

They were printed in sheets of 20 (20-Set Format M -2 panes 5 x 2 with imperforate gutter) by Percetakan Keselamatan Nasional using standard four-colour off-set lithography. Sheet markings were 1A (x4) above and below columns 1 and 5, colour dots (x4) to left and right of rows 1 and 4, Pos Malaysia emblem below R4/4. The gutter (which carried the issue title) and margins were decorated. The phosphor-coated paper gave a white fluorescent reaction and a yellow-green after-glow under ultraviolet light. The paper had watermark Multiple SPM upright. The comb perforations measured 14.0 x 13.6 with a large elliptical perforation in the middle of the vertical side. There were nine extension holes in the top margin of the upper panes of the printers sheet (30c. and 50c. seen), whereas margins were normally perforated through between panes.

Miniature sheet:

The RM2 100mm x 70mm miniature sheet contained two RM1 29mm x 34mm stamps showing:

RM1 (B): Johore Tree (Ceri Terengganu, *Lepisanthes alata*);

RM1 (C): Jentik-Jentik (*Baccaurea polyneura*). The paper had watermark Multiple SPM sideways reading down. The comb perforations measured 13.9 x 14.1 with a large elliptical perforation in the middle of the vertical side.

First day facilities:

The presentation pack was sold at RM4.30. The envelope of the presentation pack featured Downy Rose-Myrtle (Kemunting, *Rhodomyrtus tomentosa*).

The first day cover, sold at 30s., featured the Nyekak Durian (*Durio kutejensis*).

Designed by Reign Associates, this issue comprised two counter sheets with se-tenant stamps, a miniature sheet and four unstamped postcards.

Counter sheets:


- The se-tenant pairs of 40mm x 30mm stamps showed:
- 30s.(A): Gunung Kinabalu (Sabah now a UNESCO World Heritage Site) (4095m) and an orchid;
- 30s.(B): Gunung Ledang (previously known as Mount Ophir, Johore) (1276m) and a pitcher plant;
- 50s.(A): Gunung Jerai (Kedah) and orchid;
- 50s.(B): Gunung Mulu (Sarawak) (2376m) and close-up of the Pinnacles of Gunung Api (which also forms part of Mulu National Park).

They were printed in sheets of 20 (simple 4 x 5 format) by Percetakan Keselamatan Nasional using standard four-colour off-set lithography with details of the mountains picked-out by embossing. Sheet markings were the issue title in a broad, imperforate top margin, 1A(x4) above and below columns 1 and 4, colour dots (x4) to left and right of top

margin and row 5, Pos Malaysia emblem below R5/3. The phosphor-coated paper gave a greenish-white fluorescent reaction and a yellow-green afterglow under ultra-violet light. It had watermark Multiple SPM sideways reading down. The comb perforations measured 13.6 x 13.4 or 12.1 (all values).

Miniature sheet:

The 100mm x 70mm sheet contained a 50mm x 40mm RM2 stamp. The stamp showed Gunung Tahan (Pahang), the highest mountain in Malaya at 2187m, situated in the Taman Negara National Park. The background showed an orchid in a forest. The sheets were perforated $13.6/14.1 \times 14.1$ and had watermark Multiple SPM sideways reading up.

RM1: Isok Barb or Jullien's Golden Carp (Temoleh, Probarbus jullieni).

They were printed in sheets of 20 (20-Set Format L - see issue 05.17) by Percetakan Keselamatan Nasional using standard four-colour off-set lithography. Sheet markings were the issue title and various fish in gutter, 1A (x4) above and below columns 1 and 4, colour dots to left and right of top and bottom rows and Pos Malaysia emblem below R5/3. The paper gave a greenish-white fluorescent reaction and a yellow-green after-glow under ultra-violet light. The phosphor-coated paper had watermark Multiple SPM upright. The comb perforations measured 12.5 x 12.7. All margins were perforated through.

The three 40mm x 30mm stamps showed:

50s.(A): The facade mural at the Balai Budaya Tun Syed Nasir, Kuala Lumpur;

50s.(B): The Palmyra palm in nature and as part of the DBP emblem (designed by Hoessien Enas in 1957);

RM1: Dictionaries, including a palm-top computer and another digital device.

They were printed in separate sheets of 20 (20-Set Format L - see issue 05.17) by Percetakan Keselamatan Nasional using standard four-colour off-set lithography. Sheet markings were 1A (x4) above and below columns 1 and 4, colour dots to the left and right of rows 1 and 5, and Pos Malaysia emblem below R5/3. The phosphor-coated paper gave a greenish-white fluorescent reaction and a yellow-green after-glow under ultra-violet light. The paper had watermark Multiple SPM upright. Sheet markings included 1A (x4) above the right-hand column and colour dots (x4) to the right of the top row. The phosphor-coated paper gave a greenish-white fluorescent reaction and a yellow-green after-glow under ultra-violet light. It had watermark Multiple SPM upright. The comb perforations measured 12.5 x 12.7. The top and right margins were perforated through; other margins were not recorded.

First day facilities:

There was no presentation pack. The first day cover, sold at 30s., featured an oil palm estate and palm seed head. The special first day postmark included a rubber tree and oil palm seeds. The folder was sold at RM5.

Sultan Azlan Shah Gallery.

The Istana Ulu (built in 1903) at Bukit Chandran, Kuala Kangsar, Perak, had been converted into a gallery to display royal history, regalia and artefacts (including the Sultan's car collection). It was opened by Sultan Azlan Shah on 9 December 2003. The Sultan now holds Court at the Istana Iskandariah. This issue was an added starter to the 2006 programme. Designed by Professor Dato' Raja Zahabuddin Raja Yaacob, this issue comprised three counter sheets.

Counter sheets:

The 40mm x 30mm stamps showed:

30s.: Keris Taming Sari (State Kris, dating from at least 1528);

50s.: Istana Ulu;

RM1: Royal Aigrette (insignia jewellery, designed by Sultan Idris in 1911) on royal headdress.

They were printed in sheets of 20 (simple 4 x 5 format) by Percetakan Keselamatan Nasional using standard four-colour off-set lithography. Sheet markings were the issue title in the broad top margin with views of the galleries (including two Rolls Royce cars on the 30s.), 1A (x4) above and below columns 1 and 4, colour dots (x4) to left and right of row 5 and the top margin, Pos Malaysia emblem below R5/3. The phosphor-coated paper gave a greenish-white fluorescent reaction and a yellow-green after-glow under ultra-violet light. The paper normally had watermark Multiple SPM sideways reading down, but a small quantity of each value is known reading up ⁴. The comb perforations measured 12.1 or 13.6 x 13.4 for all values. The bottom and side margins were perforated through, the top being imperforate.

First day facilities:

There was no presentation pack. The first day cover, sold at 30s., featured the Istana. The special first day postmark included the Istana. The folder was sold at RM5.

They were printed in sheets of 20 (simple 4 x 5 format) by Percetakan Keselamatan Nasional using standard four-colour off-set lithography. Sheet markings were the issue title in the broad top margin, 1A (x4) above and below columns 1 and 4, colour dots (x4) to the left and right of row 5 and to the left and right of the top margin, and Pos Malaysia emblem below R5/3. The phosphor-coated paper gave a greenish-white fluorescent reaction and a yellow-green after-glow under ultra-violet light. The paper had watermark Multiple SPM sideways reading down. The comb perforations measured 12.1 or 13.6 x 13.4 for all values. The bottom and side margins were perforated through, the top being imperforate.

Miniature sheet:

The 70mm x 100mm miniature sheet contained a se-tenant pair of two 30mm x 40mm stamps showing the harvest festivals of:

- RM1 (B): Tadau Ka'amatan (Ka'amatan is the Sabah Kadazan Harvest Festival. Tadau is a beauty pageant that forms part of the celebration);
- RM1 (C): Gawai Dayak (Sarawak 1 June festival celebrated by the Iban or Sea Dayak and Bidayuh or Land Dayak peoples).

The paper and watermark were as for counter sheets. The perforations measured 12.7×12.5 .

Designed by Hazel Design, this issue comprised three counter sheets and a miniature sheet.

Traditional Costumes.

The three 30mm x 40mm stamps showed:

50s.(A): Malay male Baju Melayu Cekak Musang and female Baju Kurung Telok Belanga Songket;

50s.(B): Chinese male Samfoo and female Cheongsam;

50s.(C): Indian male Vaishti and female Saree and Choli.

They were printed in separate sheets of 20 (20-set Format K - see issue 05.16) by Percetakan Keselamatan Nasional using standard four-colour off-set lithography. Sheet markings were issue title, illustration and Pos Malaysia emblem in central imperforate gutter, 1A (x4) above and below columns 1 and 4, colour dots (x4) to left and right of rows 1 and 5. The phosphor-coated paper gave a greenish-white fluorescent reaction and a yellow-green after-glow under ultra-violet light. It had watermark Multiple SPM sideways reading down. The comb perforations measured 12.7 x 12.5.

Miniature sheet:

The 70mm x 100mm RM2 miniature sheet contained a vertical setenant pair of two 30mm x 40mm RM1 stamps showing:
