Joint Issue with Brunei - Unique Marine Life.



This issue featured marine life peculiar to the South China Sea and was originally proposed for issue on 21 December 2006. The stamps were dated "2006" reflecting this change of plan (the Brunei stamps were the same).

Designed by Reign Associates, this issue comprised two separate counter sheets and a miniature sheet with two stamps. The stamp designated "B" in each case below was a fish found in Brunei waters.

Counter sheets:

- The two 40mm x 30mm stamps showed:
- 50s.(A): Leaf Scorpionfish (Ikan Scorpion, *Taenianotus triacanthus*);
- 50s.(B): Orange-lined Triggerfish (Babakan Takat, *Balistapus undulatus*).

They were printed in separate sheets of 20 (20-Set Format O) by Percetakan Keselamatan Nasional using standard four-colour off-set lithography. Sheet markings were the issue title and an enlarged illustration in place of R1/1-R2/2, 1A (x4) above and below columns 1 and 4, colour dots (x4) to the left and right of rows 1 and 6, "Design A" (or B) below R6/2, Pos Malaysia emblem below R6/3. The phosphor-coated paper gave a greenish-white fluorescent reaction and a yellow-green after-glow under ultra-violet light. The paper had watermark Multiple SPM sideways reading down. The comb perforations normally measured 13.6 x 13.4, but the two part-rows at the top of the sheet were perforated 12.1, making R1 12.1 all-around and R2 12.1/13.6 x 12.1.

Miniature sheet:

The 100mm x 70mm sheet contained two 40mm x 30mm RM1 stamps showing:

- RM1 (A): Chambered Nautilus (Nautilus, *Nautilus pompilius*);
- RM1 (B): Spotted Boxfish (male) (Buntan Kaban Berintik, *Ostracion meleagris*);

against a reef background with a sea anemone prominent. The comb perforations measured 13.6×13.4 . The paper was as for the counter sheets.

First day facilities:

There was no presentation pack.

The first day cover, sold at 30s., featured Nautilus shell, starfish, Scorpionfish and ferns.

The special first day postmark included a Scorpionfish.

The folder was sold at RM5.

Visit Malaysia Year 2007.



Visit Malaysia Year 2007 was sub-titled "Celebrating 50 Years of Nationhood". This issue was originally proposed for 27 January 2007. The event emblem was a stylised hibiscus.

Designed by the Visit Malaysia Year 2007 Secretariat, this issue comprised two counter sheets containing se-tenant pairs of stamps, a miniature sheet, a booklet and a postal stationery postcard.

Counter sheets:

The stamps showed:

30s.(A): "Flora & Fauna" (Rhinoceros Hornbill, Rafflesia, Rajah Brooke's Birdwing and Mount Kinabalu);

30s.(B): "Golden Treasures of the Sea" (divers on reef with assorted fish and corals);

50s.(A): "Religious Diversity & Tolerance" (Hindu temple (Penang?), Christ Church (Malacca), National Mosque in a crescent, and Chinese temple);

50s.(B): "Cultures & Craft of Unity" (Malay Tepak Sireh, Baba-Nyonya Siah tiffin-basket, Chinese lanterns and Indian oil lamps).

They were printed in sheets of 20 (simple 2 pairs x 5 format) by Percetakan Keselamatan Nasional using standard fourcolour off-set lithography. Sheet markings were 1A (x4) above and below columns 1 and 4, colour dots (x4) to the left and right of enlarged top margin and R5, issue title in top margin, Pos Malaysia emblem below R5/3. The phosphorcoated paper gave a greenish-white fluorescent reaction and a yellow-green after-glow under ultra-violet light. The

paper had watermark Multiple SPM sideways reading down. The comb perforations measured 12.1 (normal) or 13.4×13.6 (some sheets of both values).

Miniature sheet:

The 100mm x 70mm RM2 sheet showed a composite of the women in cultural costumes shown on the booklet. At the left, the 30mm x 50mm stamp showed the Petronas Twin Towers and the Prime Minister's Complex at Putrajaya on a background of the national flag and Visit Malaysia Year 2007 emblem. A Rajah Brooke's Birdwing butterfly appeared in the foreground of the sheet. The paper was as for the counter sheets, but with inverted watermark. The perforation was 13.4 x 13.6.



Booklet:

The RM3 selvedge booklet "Faces of Malaysia & Its Culinary Delights" contained ten 40mm x 30mm 30s. stamps in a block of 10 (5 x 2) attached by the left-hand selvedge. The top row of stamps showed women in cultural costumes:

The bottom row showed corresponding food:

The paper was as used for the counter sheet stamps. The stamps were perforated 13.6 x 13.4 and the selvedge was perforated through. The watermark was normally sideways reading down, but it also existed reading up. The booklet is reported ⁸ to have sold out very quickly.

The 140mm x 105mm postcard (sold at 80c.) showed fireworks, "Eye on Malaysia" Ferris wheel (Lake Titiwangsa Park, Kuala Lumpur), Petronas Twin Towers, space scene with Space Shuttle OV-101 "Enterprise" on the Boeing 747-123 transporter aircraft N905NA which took it on a tour in 1983 (a Shuttle was expected to attend the Malaysian International Aerospace Exhibition in June-August 2007), dancers, motor cycle race, bicycle race and other celebrations. It bore a 25mm x 31mm 50c. pre-printed stamp showing the event emblem on a pattern of 20 concentric hearts. It had simulated perforation 14.0. It was printed on lightly blue fluorescent gloss white card, without phosphor.

The presentation pack was sold at RM4 containing just the counter sheet stamps. The envelope of the presentation pack featured Mount Kinabalu, Porta da Santiago (Malacca), Petronas Twin Towers, dancers and beach with bathers and sharks.

The first day cover, sold at 30s., featured dancers, fireworks, Petronas Twin Towers and the Ferris wheel.

The special first day postmark included the hibiscus part of the event emblem.

Installation of 13th King.



Sultan Mizan Zainal Abidin of Trengganu was elected King on 13 December 2006 and installed on 26 April 2007. This issue was originally proposed for 5 April 2007.

Designed by Professor Dato' Raja Zahabuddin Raja Yaacob, this issue comprised three counter sheets.

The 30mm x 40mm stamps showed:

30s.: The King in civilian uniform in front of the coat of arms;

50s.: The King in military uniform in front of the Istana Negara;

RM1: The King in civilian uniform in front of the throne.

They were printed in sheets of 20 (simple 5 x 4 format) by Percetakan Keselamatan Nasional using standard four-colour off-set lithography. Sheet markings were issue title and illustration in broad top margin, colour dots (x4) to the left and right of rows 1 and 4, 1A (x4) above and below columns 1 and 5, and Pos Malaysia emblem below R4/3. The phosphor-coated paper gave a greenish-white fluorescent reaction and a yellow-green after-glow under ultra-violet light. The phosphor-coated paper had watermark Multiple SPM sideways reading down. The comb perforations measured 12.7 x 12.5. Left, right and bottom margins were perforated through, but the top margin was not.

First day facilities:

The presentation pack was sold at RM4. The envelope of the presentation pack featured the pair of maces.

The first day cover, sold at 30s., featured the Istana Negara (built 1928 for Chan Wing, a Chinese millionaire, used as the Japanese Army Officers' Mess in World War Two, then bought by the Selangor Government for the Sultan and became the King's palace in 1957).

The special first day postmark included an elevation of the Istana.

The folder was sold at RM5.

This issue was originally proposed for 26 June 2004. The original issue having been cancelled, it was then proposed for 28 February 2007, then 3 May, then 5 April, then 3 May again!

Designed by Reign Associates, this issue comprised three counter sheets and a miniature sheet.

Counter sheets:

The 40mm x 30mm stamps showed:


30s.: Brown Tree Toad (Kodok Pokok, Pedostibes hosii);

50s.(A): Spotted Tree Frog (Katak Perang, Nyctixalus pictus);

50s.(B): Long-nosed or Malayan Horned Frog (Katak Tanduk, Megophrys nasuta).

They were printed in separate sheets of 20 (simple 4 x 5 format) by Percetakan Keselamatan Nasional using standard four-colour off-set lithography. Sheet markings were issue title in enlarged top margin, 1A (x4) above and below columns 1 and 4, colour dots (x4) to the left and right of top margin and R5, and Pos Malaysia emblem below R5/3. The phosphor-coated paper gave a greenish-white fluorescent reaction and a yellow-green after-glow under ultra-violet light. The paper had watermark Multiple SPM sideways reading down. The 30s. exists with watermark reading up. The comb perforations measured 12.1 or 13.6 x 13.4 for all stamps, the latter being reported to be "more difficult" by local sources. Left, right and bottom margins were perforated through, but the top margin was not.

Frog Species.



The first day cover, sold at 30s., featured frogs. The special first day postmark included a frog. The folder was sold at RM5.

Miniature sheet:

The 100mm x 70mm sheet featured Lesser Swamp Frog (Katak Paya, *Rana laterimaculata*) on the 35mm x 34mm RM1 stamp and Wallace's Flying Frog (Katak Pokok Terbang Wallace, *Rhacophorus nigropalmatus*) on the background. It was on the same paper as the counter sheets and was perforated 13.3, the bottom in-fill line being irregular. The sheet existed with "Katak" in a lighter brown. It was reported that only one example was found in a pack of 100 sheets and it was probably the result of inking variation.

First day facilities:

The presentation pack was sold at RM4. The envelope of the presentation pack featured frogs.

Air Transportation.

This issue marked the 60th Anniversary of post-war civil air services in Malaya, between Kuala Lumpur and Singapore. It was originally proposed for 27 March 2007. The actual anniversary was 1 May.

Designed by Bates Malaysia Sdn. Bhd., it comprises three counter sheets, a miniature sheet and an aerogramme.

Counter sheets:

The three 40mm x 30mm stamps showed:

30s.: Short SC.7 Skyvan utility transport;

50s.(A): GAF N22 Nomad utility transport;

50s.(B): De Havilland Canada DHC-7-110 Dash 7 short take-off and landing (STOL) airliner.

They were printed in sheets of 20 (simple 4 x 5 format) by Percetakan Keselamatan Nasional using standard four-colour off-set lithography. Sheet markings were issue title in broad top margin, 1A (x4) above and below columns 1 and 4, colour dots (x4) to the left and right of rows 1 and 5, Pos Malaysia emblem below R5/3. The phosphor-coated paper gave a greenish-white fluorescent reaction and a yellow-green after-glow under ultra-violet light. The paper had watermark Multiple SPM sideways reading down. The comb perforations measured 12.1. Left, right and bottom margins were perforated through and the top margin was imperforate.

Miniature sheet:

The 100mm x 70mm RM1 miniature sheet contained a se-tenant pair of 40mm x 30mm stamps showing:

- RM1 (A): Airspeed Consul 5-seat airliner as used on first flight in 1947;
- RM1 (B): Douglas DC3 21-seat airliner, also used in 1947.

The background of the sheet showed line drawings of the Consul. The paper was as used for the counter sheets. The stamps were perforated 13.6×13.4 .

Aerogramme:

The 50s. aerogramme measured 231mm x 308mm unfolded, 196mm x 105mm folded. In Format B (see Section 10 of Chapter 3 in Volume 1), it had an overall background of feint clouds with a Consul front elevation over the front and a Skyvan underside plan view on the other two panels. The front panel had four lines for address. The 80mm x 30mm 50c. "stamp" showed Skyvan, Nomad and Dash 7 and had simulated perforation 12.1. The back had bilingual descriptive text and five address lines. The paper had very little fluorescence





and no phosphor markings. The sheet was embossed at the fold lines to assist folding. It was sold at face value.

First day facilities:

The presentation pack was sold at RM4. The envelope of the presentation pack featured a Consul. The first day cover, sold at 30s., featured a Dash 7 and a Skyvan.

The first day postmark included a front elevation of a Consul.

The folder was sold at RM5.

Historic Clock Towers (II).



This issue was originally proposed for 24 May 2007.

Designed by Hazel Design, this issue comprised three counter sheets and a postal stationery postcard.

Counter sheets:


The 30mm x 50mm stamps showed:

- 30s.: The Birch Memorial Clock Tower, Ipoh (erected 1909 in memory of J W W Birch, the assassinated first Resident; The tower has, above its base, a frieze showing the "History of Civilisation", including a controversial picture of the Prophet Mohammed which was "modified" in the 1970s);
- 50s.: The Atkinson Clock Tower, Kota Kinabalu (erected 1905 in memory of Francis George Atkinson, first Resident, who died of malaria aged 28);
- RM1: The Big Clock Tower, Alor Star (erected 1912 near Masjid Zahir).

They were printed in sheets of 20 (20-Set Format K - see issue 05.16) by Percetakan Keselamatan Nasional using standard four-colour off-set lithography. Sheet markings were issue title, enlarged picture of the relevant tower and Pos Malaysia emblem in gutter, 1A (x4) above and below columns 1 and 4, colour dots (x4) to the left and right of rows 1 and 5. The phosphor-coated paper gave a greenish-white fluorescent reaction and a yellow-green after-glow under ultra-violet light. The paper had watermark Multiple SPM sideways reading up. The comb perforations measured 13.4 x 13.6, but the row of perforations to the left of the gutter was 14.0, meaning that column 2 (one-in-four stamps) was 13.4 x 13.6/14.0. All margins were perforated through.

Postcard:





The 148mm x 104mm postcard was sold at 80s. The picture side of the card showed the Kelantan State Mosque Clock Tower, Kota Bharu, whilst the 20s. "stamp" showed the Medan Pasar Clock Tower, Kuala Lumpur (erected 1937 to mark the Coronation of King George VI). A photograph of this tower appeared in feint at the left of the card front. The card was slightly fluorescent, without phosphor. The "stamp" had simulated perforation 13.4 x 13.8/13.6.

First day facilities:

The presentation pack was sold at RM4. The envelope of the presentation pack featured Kota Bharu Clock Tower. The first day cover, sold at 30s., featured Fraser's Hill Clock Tower, Pahang. The special first day postmark included a Moorish clock tower. The folder was sold at RM5.

Designed by Reign Associates, this issue comprised a counter sheet containing a se-tenant strip of four, a miniature sheet and a booklet.

Counter sheet:

The 40mm x 30mm stamps showed events from the following folk tales:

50s.(A): Bawang Putih Bawang Merah (a Malaysian equivalent of Cinderella);

50s.(B): Badang (a fisherman who spares a poacher and becomes a strong warrior);

50s.(C): Sang Kancil and the Crocodile (How the mouse deer tricked the crocodiles to form stepping stones by claiming the Sultan Sulaiman had ordered him to count them);

50s.(D): Sang Kancil helps Kerbau (How the mouse deer saved a buffalo trapped by an ungrateful crocodile).

They were printed in sheets of 20 (1 strip x 5) by Percetakan Keselamatan Nasional using standard four-colour off-set lithography, giving one column per design. Sheet markings were issue title in broad top margin, 1A (x4) above and below columns 1 and 4, colour dots (x4) to the left and right of top margin and row 5, Pos Malaysia emblem below R5/3. The phosphor-coated paper gave a greenish-white fluorescent reaction and a yellow-green after-glow under ultraviolet light. The paper had watermark Multiple SPM sideways reading down. The comb perforations measured 13.6 x 13.4. The top margin was imperforate and the rest perforated through.

Booklet:

The booklet measured 115mm x 65mm folded and contained ten 30s. stamps in a se-tenant pane of five designs. The cover showed Raja Bersiung (synopsis not available). Four of the five designs were as 50s.(A)-(D) above. The 30s.(E) showed Mat Jenin (a day-dreamer). The stamps were arranged in the pane as shown. The paper had watermark Multiple SPM sideways reading either up or down. The comb perforations measured 13.6 x 13.4. The stamp pane was folded between columns 2/3 and 4/5.

Miniature sheet:

The 100mm x 70mm miniature sheet with 50mm x 38mm RM5 stamp showed Si Tanggang (a seafarer who disowned his aged parents and brought disaster upon himself and his ship). Si Tanggang's coat was embossed and picked out in hot-pressed silver. The paper had watermark Multiple SPM sideways reading down. The comb perforations measured 14.1.

First day facilities:

The presentation pack was sold at RM4.50. The envelope of the presentation pack featured Mat Jenin.

The first day cover, sold at 30s., featured Mat Jenin.

The first day postmark included Sang Jancil. The folder was sold at RM5.



This issue was inscribed "Insects Series III", but this title had previously been used for the Dragonflies issue of 2000 (see issue 00.29), so it was actually Series IV. It was originally proposed for 26 April, then 10 July.

Designed by Hazel Design, this issue comprised two counter sheets, containing se-tenant pairs of 30s. and 50s. stamps respectively, and a miniature sheet.

Counter sheets:

The 30mm x 40mm stamps showed:

30s.(A): Fiery-beaked Lantern Bug (Serangga Tanglung, Fulgora pyrorhyncha);

30s.(B): Fruit Bug (Pianggang Perosak Buah, Dysdercus cingulatus);

50s.(A): Short-horned Grasshopper (Belalang Kunyit, Valanga nigricornis);

50s.(B): Indonesian Longicorn (Kumbang Sesungut Panjang, Rhaphipodus hopei).

They were printed in sheets of 20 (20-Set Format K - see issue 05.16) by Percetakan Keselamatan Nasional using standard four-colour off-set lithography. Sheet markings were the issue title in the gutter with Pos Malaysia emblem below, 1A (x4) above and below columns 1 and 4, colour dots to the left and right of rows 1 and 5. The phosphor-coated paper gave a greenish-white fluorescent reaction and a yellow-green after-glow under ultra-violet light. The paper had watermark Multiple SPM sideways reading down. The comb perforations measured 12.7 x 12.5.

Miniature sheet:

The 120mm x 70mm sheet showed a variety of insects, including the Atlas Moth (Rama-rama Atlas, Attacus atlas) and the world's longest stick insect, Phobaeticus kirbyi, and larvae, and contained a 50mm x 40mm RM5 stamp with male and female Emperor Moths (Rama-rama Emperor, Antheraea helferi) picked out by transparent diffraction foil to simulate the iridescent patterns of the insect wings. The positioning of the markings on the diffraction foil patterns appeared random. All those seen were significantly different. The sheet had watermark upright. The perforations measured 14.1.



First day facilities:

The presentation pack was sold at RM4. The envelope of the presentation pack featured *Heteropteryx dilatata* (incorrectly shown as *Heteroptera dilatata*) and *Chrysochroa buquetti*.

The first day cover, sold at 30s., featured the female Emperor Moth and a beetle.

The special first day postmark included a moth.

The folder was sold at RM5.

Bangkok 2007 Stamp Exhibition (3 August 2007):

A further miniature sheet was released on 3 August 2007 only at Bangkok 2007, the 20th Asian International Stamp Exhibition, held from 3 to 12 August 2007 at Siam Paragon Hall Exhibition and Conference Centre. This differed from the normal issued sheet by having the Bangkok 2007 emblem above "RM5".

Technical details were as for the normal sheet. So far as is known, this sheet has been generally issued in Malaysia. Only 5,000 were printed, of which 3,000 were taken to Bangkok and completely sold out at the Exhibition. The balance of 2,000 was



"reserved for the archives", but 500 were subsequently sold to a Thai dealer, who had placed an order at the Exhibition, to the annoyance of local dealers and collectors. ⁸ The balance may be offered for sale later, as Pos Malaysia offered miniature sheets dating from 2004 to 2007, some previously unseen, to subscribers in late 2008.

An example, presumably a proof, has been seen numbered "P 000000" to the left of the Bangkok emblem.

200th Anniversary of Police Di-Raja Malaysia.

24 July 2007.



The first recorded legal provisions for policing in Malaya dated from the Malacca Sultanate, pre-1511. This issue commemorated the First Penang Charter of Justice, signed by King George III on 25 March 1807, which separated the Judicial and Legal branches of law enforcement in Penang, paving the way for the creation of the first separate Police service. It also marked the founding on the same day of the Penang Police, which was additionally responsible for providing the fire service.

The Second Charter of Justice of 9 August 1827 established the rule of law in Singapore and the Straits Settlements Police came into being around this time. Johore created its police service in 1882. The FMS Police (later Malay States Police) was founded in 1896, and Kedah, Kelantan, Perlis and Trengganu police forces in 1909.

The police service played a major part in countering the first (1948-1960) and second (1968-1990) Communist insurgencies. The second, less well known, insurgency ended with the "laying down of arms" of the Malayan Communist Party on 2 December 1989 and of the North Kalimantan Communist Party on 17 October 1990. In 1948, a "Flying Squad" was established to fight Communist insurgents. This was later renamed the Jungle Squad, then the Jungle Company, the Police Field Force and, in 1997 to reflect its post-insurgency role, the General Operation Force.

The Federation of Malaya Police absorbed the separate state services circa 1948, and became the Royal Federation of Malaya Police Force on 24 July 1958. It was reorganised as the Royal Malaysian Police Force on 16 September 1963 to incorporate those of Sabah and (until 1965) Singapore together with the Sarawak Constabulary.

This issue was a late addition to the programme, originally planned for May-June 2007. Designed by Hazel Design, it comprised three counter sheets (one 30s. and two different 50s.).

Counter sheets:

The 40mm x 30mm stamps showed:

30s.: Hutton Lane Police Station, Penang (1880), Penang Fire Brigade (1883) and a Penang Peon (constable);

50s.(A): Flying Squad (1948) and Royal Federation of Malaya Police Force uniform of 1958;

50s.(B): Putrajaya District Police Headquarters, Proton police car, motor cycles and male and female officers (2007).

They were printed in sheets of 20 (new 20-Set Format P) by Percetakan Keselamatan Nasional using standard four-colour off-set lithography. The central label showed the issue title and an additional illustration (30s.: early police station; 50s.(A): parade, 50s.(B): badge). Other sheet markings were 1A (x4) above and below columns 1 and 4, colour dots (x4) to the left and right of rows 1 and 6, Pos Malaysia emblem below R6/3, and "Design 1" on the 50s.(A) or "Design 2" on the 50s.(B) below R6/2. The phosphor-coated paper gave a greenishwhite fluorescent reaction and a yellow-green afterglow under ultra-violet light. The paper had watermark Multiple SPM sideways reading down. The comb perforations measured 13.6 x 13.4.

20-Set Format P.

First day facilities:

There was no presentation pack.

The first day cover, sold at 30s., featured radio operator, machine gunner and officer triggering a fire alarm circa 1948.

The special first day postmark included a Police badge. The folder was sold at RM5.

Negri Sembilan Royal Heritage.

This issue selebrated the Minangkabau (Sumatran) dynasty cultural heritage, from which the present royal house of Biduanda descends. It also happens to be the 40th year of the reign of Yang Di-Pertuan Besar Tuanku Ja'afar. This issue was originally announced as "Visual Arts Heritage" for release on 26 July 2007.

Designed by Reign Associates, the issue comprises three counter sheets and a miniature sheet

Counter sheets:

The 30mm x 40mm stamps showed:

- 30s.: The eight ceremonial long kris (which originated at Pagar Ruyung, Sumatra) and the Head of State in army uniform;
- 50s.: State thrones in the Balai Rong Seri (audience chamber) of the Istana Besar Seri Menanti, Kuala Pilah (built 1931), and the Head of State in navy uniform;
- RM1: The Head of State in state uniform and Sceptre of Regalia state emblem used since 1948 (9-pointed star, sword of state and its sheath and the Changgai Puteri staff).

They were printed in sheets of 20 (simple 5 x 4 format) by Percetakan Keselamatan Nasional using standard four-colour off-set lithography. The sheet had broad margins at top and bottom, the top one containing the issue title. Other sheet markings were 1A (x4) above and below columns 1 and 5, colour dots to the left and right of rows 1 and 4, Pos Malaysia emblem below R4/3. The phosphor-coated paper gave a greenish-white fluorescent reaction and a yellow-green after-glow under ultra-violet light. The paper had watermark Multiple SPM sideways reading down. The comb perforations measured 12.7 x 12.5. The top margin was imperforate and the rest perforated through.

Miniature sheet:

The 100mm x 70mm miniature sheet contained a 30mm x 40mm RM2 stamp showing Yang Di-Pertuan Besar Tuanku Ja'afar and his consort Tuanku Najihah Binti Tuanku Besar Burhanudin. The sheet background included the Istana Lama Seri Menanti (Old Seri Menanti Palace, which was built in 1902-1908 and replaced by the new palace in 1931). Paper and perforations were as for the counter sheets.

First day facilities:

There was no presentation pack.

The first day cover, sold at 30s., featured the Istana Lama.

The first day postmark included the state emblem.

40th Anniversary of ASEAN.

The anniversary was marked by an omnibus issue for all ten ASEAN states, comprising one stamp for each state in a miniature sheet format. This issue was originally proposed for 6 August 2007. It should be noted that all the other participating countries produced a sheetlet in the format 2×5 and that Malaysia cropped the pictures to a greater extent than any of the other participants. When, on 6 June 2008, ASEAN published a folder containing all 10 sheets, the Malaysian half-sheet had to be inserted sideways.

Designed by Reign Associates based on images by the photographer shown after the building in the list below, this issue comprises a counter sheet which could be sub-divided into two miniature sheets by tearing along inter-panneau perforations.

Sheet markings were the issue title above each pane, Pos Malaysia emblem below each pane, 1A at left and right of top margin of top pane and bottom margin of bottom pane, colour dots (x4) to the left and right of each pane. The margins were decorated with flags of the member states and views of the KTM headquarters. The phosphor-coated paper gave a greenish-white fluorescent reaction and a yellow-green after-glow under ultra-violet light. The paper had watermark Multiple SPM sideways reading down. The comb perforations measured 13.8 x 14.1. The inter-panneau perforation measured 13.5. Top and bottom margins were imperforate with side margins perforated through.

First day facilities:

There was no presentation pack.

- The first day cover, sold at 30s., featured a line drawing of the central entrance of the KTM headquarters.
- The special first day postmark included the event emblem.
- The folder was sold at RM5.

Folder (6 June 2008):

A folder containing the sheetlets issued by all ten ASEAN countries was issued on 6 June 2008 in a matching card slip case. It sold at (Singapore) \$48. As it lacks any publisher's imprint, it would appear to have been published by ASEAN itself. It was interesting that all the countries had complied with an apparent brief to produce a 2 x 5 sheetlet with

illustrations in alphabetical order of member state with the exception of Malaysia (5 x 2) and Laos (Laos illustration first). Malaysia had also cropped the pictures to a greater extent than the others.

The Razaksat (originally known as MACSat) electro-optical Earth imaging satellite was scheduled for launch for Astronautic Technology (M) Sdn. Bhd. from Omelek Island in the Marshall Islands in 2006 or 2007 on the third flight of the private venture SpaceX Falcon 1 liquid-fuelled rocket. Unfortunately, flights 1 and 2 were failures, so the launch was cancelled, and with it an intended stamp issue.

It was eventually launched on Flight 5 on 16 July 2009.

31 August 2007.

Golden Jubilee of Independence.



This issue marked the 50th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence of the Federation of Malaya in 1957.

Designed by Jari Seni Communication based on designs by Kementerian Kebudayaan Kesenian dan Warisan Malaysia (Ministry of Culture, Art & Heritage), this issue comprises two counter sheets with se-tenant pairs of stamps and a miniature sheet.

Counter sheets:

The 40mm x 30mm stamps showed:

- 30s.(A): 1957: Sultan Abdul Samad Building, Tunku Abdul Rahman, National Monument and Parliament Building; 30s.(B): 2007: Petronas Twin Towers, KL Tower, Prime Minister's Complex Building (Putrajaya), Proton car and
- Penang Bridge.
- 50s.(A): Tuanku Abdul Rahman signing the Declaration of Independence;
- 50s.(B): Golden Jubilee emblem

They were printed in sheets of 20 (simple 4 x 5 format) by Percetakan Keselamatan Nasional using standard four-colour off-set lithography. Design A appeared in columns 1 and 3, B in 2 and 4. Sheet markings were the issue title in the broad top margin. 1A (x4) above and below columns 1 and 4, colour dots (x4) to the right and left of rows 1 and 5, Pos Malaysia emblem below R5/3. The phosphor-coated paper gave a greenish-white fluorescent reaction and a yellow-green after-glow under ultra-violet light. The paper had watermark Multiple SPM sideways reading down, but the 50s. exists reading up. The comb perforations measured 13.6 x 13.4. Bottom, left and right margins were perforated through. The top margin was imperforate.

Razaksat.

Miniature Sheet:

The 100mm x 70mm miniature sheet had the "50" emblem hot-stamped in gold foil. It contained a 70mm x 34mm stamp RM5 showing the National Flag. The background showed the five Prime Ministers: Tunku Abdul Rahman (1957-1970), Tun Abdul Razak Hussein (1970-1976), Tun Hussein Onn (1976-1981), Tun Dr Mahatir Mohamad (1981-2003), Dato' Seri Abdullah Ahmad Badawi (2003-date). The paper was as used for counter sheets. The stamp was perforated 13.3.

Booklet:

The RM3 booklet showed the declaration of independence in 1957. It contained a se-tenant pane of ten 30s. stamps attached by the left selvedge.

The five designs appeared in successive columns in the pane and showed the leaders credited with moving Malaya towards independence:

30s.(C): Dato' Onn Jaafar (founder of UMNO);

30s.(D): Tunku Abdul Rahman Putra Al-Haj;

30s.(E): Tun Abdul Razak;

30s.(F): Tun Tan Cheng Lock (founder of Malaysian Chinese Association);

30s.(G): Tun V. T. Sambanthan (President, Malaysian Indian Congress 1955-1973).

The same paper was used, but with watermark reading either up or down. The comb perforations measured 13.6 x 13.4. The booklet is reported 8 to have sold out within hours, with strong demand from members of the political parties whose leaders' portraits appeared on the stamps.

10th Aga Khan Award for Architecture.

The speed with which issues can be prepared today was exemplified by this issue, which was not foreseen on 17 August when the Bureau prepared the paperwork for the Independence issue! It marked the hosting of the 2007 Award ceremony at the Petronas Twin Towers on 4 September. The Aga Khan Awards for Architecture were established by the Aga Khan Foundation in 1977 and were presented every three years to building projects, whether new or restoration, that "successfully address the need and aspirations of Muslim societies". The Petronas Twin Towers won a 2004 award.

Designed by Irma Boom, this issue comprised a single counter sheet.

Counter sheet:

The 30mm x 50mm 50s. stamp showed a line side-elevation drawing of the Petronas Twin Towers with the award emblem.

The sheets were printed in sheets of 20 (simple 5 x 4 format) by Percetakan Keselamatan Nasional using five-colour off-set lithography in blue, red, grey, black and gold. In keeping with the design, the sheet margins were not decorated, except that the gold edge of the stamp was bled into the margins. Sheet markings were the issue title above R1/4-5, award emblem above R1/3, colour dots (x5) to the left of R1/1 and right of R4/5, 1A (x5) to the right of R1/5 and left of R4/1, the Pos Malaysia emblem below R4/3. The phosphor-coated paper gave a greenish-white fluorescent reaction and a yellow-green after-glow under ultra-violet light. The paper had watermark Multiple SPM sideways reading up. The comb perforations measured 13.4 x 13.6.

First day facilities:

There was no presentation pack.

The first day cover, sold at 30s., featured the line drawing in a ground plan of one of the towers (eight-pointed star with semi-circles between the points).

The special first day postmark included the ground plan.

It was reported ⁸ that these stamps sold out within hours, that only 100,000 stamps (5,000 sheets) were printed and that the bulk was reported to have been bought by the Aga Khan Foundation. Pos Malaysia is understood to have not anticipated such a demand as this issue was launched immediately after the Merdeka issue.

Designed by Prof. Dato' Raja Zahabuddin Raja Yaacob, this issue comprises a counter sheet containing two sheetlets of 14 different stamps. It was notable that the emblems of the three Federal Territories were not included.

Sheet markings were issue title in broad gutter, 1A (x4) above and below columns 1 and 5, colour dots (x4) to the left and right of R1 and R4, Pos Malaysia emblem below R4/3. The phosphor-coated paper gave a greenish-white fluorescent reaction and a yellow-green after-glow under ultra-violet light. The paper had watermark Multiple SPM sideways reading down. The comb perforations measured 13.8 x 13.6 and had an elongated elliptical perforation at the mid-point of their sides.

Kuala Lumpur Grand Prix International Horse Show.



The Kuala Lumpur Grand Prix was classified by the International Equestrian Federation (FEI) in its highest "5-Star" category and had been held annually since 2003 at the Stadium Putra, Bukit Jalil, Kuala Lumpur. It was the only such world-class event in the Asia-Pacific region. This was a late addition to the programme, initially due for issue on 1 November 2007, but it was postponed to 13 December 2007.

Designed by La Scheers Co. Sdn. Bhd., this issue comprises three counter sheets showing "Warmblood" showjumping horse breeds.

Counter sheets:

The 30mm x 40mm counter sheet stamps showed:

30s.: Oldenburger (first bred in Germany, 17th Century);

50s.(A): Hanoverian (Germany, 1735);

50s.(B): Dutch Warmblood (Netherlands, 1960s).

They were printed in sheets of 20 (20-Set Format M - see issue 06.3) by Percetakan Keselamatan Nasional using standard four-colour off-set lithography. Sheet markings were issue title on central gutter, 1A (x4) above and below columns 1 and 5, colour dots (x4) to the left and right of rows 1 and 4, "DESIGN A" (or B) below R4/2 on 50c. only. The phosphor-coated paper gave a greenish-white fluorescent reaction and a yellow-green after-glow under ultra-violet light. The paper had watermark Multiple SPM sideways reading down. The comb perforations measured 13.4 x 13.6. The gutter was imperforate and all margins perforated through.

First day facilities:

There was no presentation pack. The first day cover, sold at 30s., featured the handle of a cup. The special first day postmark included a jumping horse. The folder was sold at RM5.
