### **CHAPTER FIFTY-SEVEN**

# SPECIAL SOUVENIR PRESENTATION PACKS AND ALBUMS.

From time to time, special presentation packs and albums have been produced unrelated to specific stamp issues, but, instead, intended for presentation to honoured guests as a souvenir showing some of the Malayan way of life through recent issues of its stamps. So far as is known, before the 1st Edition of this book, no previous attempt had been made to record these scarce items, so this should be treated as a preliminary survey as a basis for future research. Since then, considerably more material has come to light and this chapter has been completely rewritten and renumbered.

Most notable of these packs was the series produced for the postal conferences of the Universal Postal Union or the Commonwealth attended by delegates of all the member countries. At such events, many of the member states took the opportunity to present all the other delegations with souvenirs of the event in the form of a card or album showing some of their then-current or recent issues. Malaysia did so on a number of occasions. It would appear that different levels of souvenir may have been produced for different grades of participant! UPU albums were inscribed in French, the official language of the UPU.

All other such souvenirs were inscribed in English or Bahasa Malaysia. Albums for general use were usually undated and without any inscriptions. Approximate dates of issue can only be estimated by the latest stamps contained therein and the name of any official mentioned in any inscription that might be present. These albums usually appear to have been made up at random from whatever was to hand at the time. with little or no effort to present a formal presentation. It may well be that no two albums were alike!

One problem with collecting these souvenirs is that previous owners may have removed items for their collections. Sometimes, anachronistic items may have been substituted, such as a 1977 issue in a 1974 album. In describing contents, the author has attempted to describe undisturbed contents.

White leaves with individual black stamp mounts on the centre spread without transparent interleaf. The stamps were "written up" with brief descriptions and headings.<sup>2</sup>
